

# Harnessing the natural power of Skegness

Lincolnshire is a great place to visit for a day trip or holiday and its coastline has even more to offer for those who have an interest in their environment.

Visitors can get a glimpse of the next generation of UK power wind farms, producing low-carbon demand of more than 130.000 renewable energy for growing numbers of Britain's homes. We at Centrica are proud of the Lynn and Inner Dowsing wind farms we have built off the Skegness coast, which have been operational since 2009.

They generate enough power to meet the annual electricity homes. And in 2013 we completed the Lincs wind farm, a little further out to sea, which provides enough power for a further 200,000 homes.

Offshore wind farms harness the natural power of the wind and it's an energy that Britain's coastline has in abundance.

Generating more of our power from renewable sources will help protect us from the impact of climate change and make the UK less reliant on imported energy.

# **New-and-improved visitor centre at Gibraltar Point**

A SPECTACULAR NEW £1M VISITOR CENTRE AT GIBRALTAR POINT NATURE RESERVE WILL BEGIN TO TAKE SHAPE OVER THE COMING MONTHS.

Work has started on the brand new building, which will include a café and educational information.

It replaces the former visitor centre, which suffered extensive flood damage during the storm surge in December 2013. The new building will be raised on stilts to protect it from any future flooding.

Cllr Colin Davie. Executive Member for Economic Development at Lincolnshire County Council, said: "This is an opportunity to make Gibraltar Point even more attractive to visitors - an opportunity we intend to take full advantage of.

"The new visitor centre has been designed to make the most of the reserve's stunning views, with expansive windows facing the dunes and sea, and a rooftop viewing deck.

"Combined with the new North Sea Observatory at Chapel St Leonards. this improved attraction will help extend the traditional tourist season on the coast, providing a significant boost to the local economy."

The council has developed the ambitious plans in partnership with the Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust, who will continue to run the site.

The project is being funded by Lincolnshire County Council (£430k), the Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust (£200k) and the Government's Coastal Communities Fund (£420k).

In the meantime, Gibraltar Point remains open to visitors, with opportunities for walks and birdwatching. Temporary facilities, including catering, are provided on-site.

Neighbouring Chapel St Leonards might have more of a rural charm, with its beach huts and central green, but it also offers family entertainment by the bucketful too.

Two bustling resorts where the fun lasts all day...and lingers long after sunset.

Brave a roller coaster or two for non-stop thrills at Fantasy Island.

Close to the beach and with a tropical island theme, there are 25 thrill rides along with children's rides, amusements, bars and cafes – and one of Europe's biggest seven day markets. If that's not enough action, how about water skiing at Skegness Water Leisure Park? Or there's always monster trucks, demolition derbies and spectacular stock car racing at Skegness Stadium.





### A PICTURE POSTCARD

Fringed by a sheltered bay and miles of beach, there's something about Chapel St Leonards that makes it a second home to visitors. With its attractions, safe sands and village green, it's a true family favourite.

# COME RAIN OR SHINE...

We're lucky to be on the drier side of Britain – it's true, eastern England has less rain – but there's plenty to keep you in the holiday mood, whatever the weather.

Feed the goats and cuddle baby lambs at Hardy's Animal Farm, set in acres of countryside, yet just minutes from the beach. Rain never stops play here, with a giant outdoor play fort and Haystacks Indoor Playbarn.

And 2016 is a great year to discover our less well-known Natural Coast, with stunning new We have some of the country's ways to explore our surprisingly contrasting coastline.

So take a walk on the wild side with us!

Located between the coastal strip and the Lincolnshire Wolds, you'll find the Lincolnshire Coastal Grazing Marshes. This nationally threatened habitat supports a diverse variety of wildlife and the distinctive wetland landscape is steeped in a rich cultural history.

Various walking and cycle routes you explore the area's hidden heritage, picking out key points of interest along the way.

most important natural habitats – and among the top spots is Gibraltar Point National Nature Reserve.

Literally minutes from the bustling town centre in Skegness this is a beach for wildlife lovers rather than sun worshipers. A wildlife haven of sand dunes. saltmarsh and lagoons.



This year-round reserve, managed by Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust, hosts thousands of birds including Golden Plover, Little Terns, and Avocets. In 2016 a brand new Visitor Centre, with a wall of windows and a rooftop viewing deck, will offer stunning views.

Close by is Chapel Six Marshes, a long, sandy beach, where you'll also find one of the coast's newest installations, the 'Structures on the Edge' Sound Tower, which focuses the senses and amplifies the windy nature of the coast.

### A COAST FOR ALL SEASONS.

During autumn and winter, vast mud flats attract wading birds while sandbanks create a natural nursery for grey seal pups.

Around a million migrating birds return here each year, so it's no surprise that much of it is a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).

For much of the year grey seals at the Lincolnshire Wildlife Trusts' Donna Nook National Nature Reserve are at sea or hauled out on distant sandbanks.

But, every November and December, the seals give birth to their pups near the sand dunes: a wildlife spectacle which attracts visitors from across the world.

Last winter nearly 1800 pups were born! We'd love you to enjoy this unique experience but we ask that you stick to the viewing areas, keep your distance and under no circumstances touch the seals.

Saltfleetby-Theddlethorpe Dunes National Nature Reserve is another top spot for nature lovers, boasting striking summer displays of sea lavender.

With a beautiful stretch of sandy. unspoilt beach, Anderby Creek is as delightful as the name suggests and amongst the sand dunes is the 'Round and Round House' another of our 'Structures on the Edge' designed for all-year-round bird watching.

### TAKE A SEAT AT THE **CLOUD BAR**

Pull up a chair at the UK's first Cloud Bar. It may not serve drinks, but this bar at Anderby Creek is the UK's first purposebuilt cloud viewing platform, complete with 'Cloud Menus' and swivelling mirrors. Cheers!

Holidaying earlier or later? Put your best foot forward from 21 May to 5 June at the Lincolnshire Wolds Walking Festival, packed with routes for all abilities, or there's always plenty of festive fun at our many Christmas and themed markets.

So, whenever you visit, you'll be spoilt for choice.

### FOR A DIFFERENT SPIN...

Head for Skegness beach in November for the annual AMCA Motocross bike racing, while Mablethorpe beach plays host to winter motorbike and quad bike sand racing.

On the edge of the Lincolnshire Wolds, picturesque racing track Cadwell Park is one of the country's best circuits, and especially popular for British Superbikes.


Bowls is big in this part of the country with tournaments in Skegness taking place throughout June and July while September sees the E.B.F. Bowls Tournament.

For over forty years it has been an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, rolling countryside that challenges misconceptions of Lincolnshire being flat.

Hidden valleys, sleepy stone villages and historic market towns... welcome to the Wolds.



Choose from leisurely walks to serious treks. Enjoy 'Walkers are Welcome' towns, including Horncastle, Market Rasen and Caistor.

Join a guided walk from Lincs Wold Walking, track down your own perfect trail at anytime, or come in May and June for the Lincolnshire Wolds Walking Festival. For something completely different, go trekking with Llamas – yes, seriously!



Want a challenge? The Viking Way is a 147-mile long footpath and will be celebrating it's 40th birthday in 2016, while the Lincs Wold Way is a 76-mile circular walk taking in the best of the Wolds.

Cyclists can choose from circular routes of varying lengths, with six great cycling routes around the Louth area. Hire a bike or bring your own, but don't believe those 'Lincolnshire is flat' folk - trust us, there are also some serious challenges here!

### ONE OF THE JOYS OF WANDERING THE WOLDS IS **EXPLORING OUR** HISTORIC MARKET TOWNS.

There's Louth, the 'finest little market town in Britain', and Horncastle, famed for its antiques shops. Charming Alford, with its five-sailed windmill hosts regular arts and crafts markets.

The Edwardian spa town of Woodhall Spa is a delight, as well as home to English Golf, while Spilsby, on the southern Wolds, has been a market town for centuries.

On the edge of the Wolds, Tattershall and Coningsby are well worth a visit, particularly for the dramatic Tattershall Castle and neighbouring Coningsby's Battle of Britain Memorial Flight Visitor Centre.









Discover the Wolds on horseback. Go cross-country or how about holidaying with your four-legged friend? Canter-Hallington in Louth, at the foot of the Wolds, offers a chance to do just that.



# FROM AVIATION TO EXPLORERS, EAST LINCOLNSHIRE CAN CLAIM A LASTING LEGACY.

But our rich heritage isn't consigned to the history alive at a host of sites and attractions – with enduring links to the USA, Australia and beyond.

Our sense of adventure and pioneering spirit has helped shape the world, so take a step back in time...



**EXPERIENCE THE BIG SKIES** OF 'BOMBER COUNTY'.

From the Royal Flying Corps to scores of Second World War bomber bases, Lincolnshire has long played a key role in aviation heritage.

Today, that history comes to life at the Lincolnshire Aviation Heritage Centre, East Kirkby, an original 1940s airfield, where you can not only see a Lancaster bomber, but also take a runway taxi ride.



RAF Coningsby is home to the Battle of Britain Memorial Flight Visitor Centre, a rare opportunity to see the historic wartime aircraft seen in flypasts at major national celebrations.

At Woodhall Spa, the picturesque Petwood Hotel, which served as the Dambusters' Officers' Mess. boasts the Squadron Bar with memorabilia and tributes. Its car park also displays one of the only remaining prototypes of the famous 'Bouncing Bomb'.







### THE AUSTRALIAN CONNECTION

Botanist and explorer Sir Joseph Banks is best known for his journey with Captain Cook on the Endeavour to the South Seas and Australasia. Banks and his colleagues catalogued thousands of plants and animals. In the market town of Horncastle, you can see the blue plague which marks Banks'Town House, used by the explorer during his autumn visits to Lincolnshire as well as Banks Street, named after Sir Joseph. Just a few miles away, the village of Revesby holds many memorials to the Banks family in the church and churchyard.

# **TENNYSON COUNTRY**

Follow in the footsteps of one of our most famous poets on the Tennyson Trail.

Visit Somersby, where Alfred, Lord Tennyson spent his early years. Stroll through the countryside that inspired him. Linger in picturesque Tetford, where the 16th century White Hart Inn served as the poet's local, or discover Tennyson's 'haunt of ancient peace' at Gunby Hall, near Spilsby.

Tennyson spent his childhood holidays on the Lincolnshire coast, with the high dunes, beach and sea making Mablethorpe one of his favourite places. A celebration of his life and poetry will be held on the 6 and 7 August 2016 in the picturesque villages of Somersby, Bag Enderby and Harrington.

### THE AMERICAN CONNECTION

Years before the Pilgrim Fathers landed in Plymouth, Massachusetts, modern America took root in Virginia - and East Lincolnshire played a pivotal role.

Captain John Smith (1580-1631) - of Pocahontas fame - led those first settlers. Visit Willoughby, his birthplace, or Louth where he went to school, Alford, with its magnificent Manor House, has connections with Smith, and also religious liberal Anne Hutchinson (1591-1643), a founder of Rhode Island, as well as author Thomas Paine (1737-1809), who helped inspire the American Revolution.

Explorer John Franklin, who mapped north Canada, famously vanished while searching for the North West Passage. Franklin, from Spilsby, hit the headlines when the wreck of his ship was discovered 170 years after it disappeared.

Whether you're looking for a bite to eat on the beach or afternoon tea in a cosy cafe, we reckon we can tempt any taste bud!

We produce some of the country's best food, as well as local specialities from the famous Lincolnshire sausage and Lincoln Red, Britain's oldest breed of beef cow, to Poacher Cheese and Lincolnshire plum bread.



Mention Lincolnshire and you might simply think sausages.

While there's no arguing we do those rather well, there's an incredible spread of produce and a rich food heritage well worth exploring.

Towns like Louth, Alford, Spilsby and Horncastle have historic. produce-packed markets. Spend longer in Louth and explore this gastronomic 'foodie' town with shops selling everything from handmade chocolates, to award winning butchers, cheese shops, bakeries and fishmongers.

Horncastle's The Old Stables coffee house has won high acclaim, as has The Sebastopol Inn in Minting. Add a host of farm shops, family bakers and butchers and you have all the ingredients for a very tasty break.

And, of course, no trip to the coast is complete without fish 'n' chips... and, as everyone knows, along with fresh fish, Lincolnshire potatoes are Britain's best!





Half the fun is finding your own perfect place, but here are a few suggestions:

The Fat Seagull Café and Bistro is a great example of the changing face of the Lincolnshire coast with a fresh, imaginative menu, relaxed coastal décor and a fantastic location, close to the beach at Sandilands.

Fancy a pint in an old gas light office from the 1800s? Not only is The Gas Lamp Lounge in Louth an unusual venue, but it's also home to the Fulstow microbrewery – and the only place their beer is served.

Talking of beer, family brewery Batemans, in Wainfleet, has been producing award-winning ales since 1874. Based in an old windmill, Batemans is one of the country's most picturesque breweries and offers brewery tours plus special events.

Sweet tooth? Farmer Brown's Ice Cream Parlour near Alford - a gateway to the Lincolnshire Coastal Country Park - has luxury dairy ice cream, while Dennets, still going strong after four generations, is on sale at shops, pubs and restaurants.

As well as a huge choice of things to do and places to see in East Lincolnshire, there is plenty more to explore right on the doorstep...

Head just a little further afield for some great family days out, from Lincoln, a city brimming with history, to Stamford, one of England's finest Georgian stone towns.



### **BOSTON**

Travel south along the Wash and rising above the vast Lincolnshire Fens is another skylinedominating church tower.

The Boston Stump – all 272 feet of it – boasts plenty of history too, including the founding of Boston, USA. The port here is where the Pilgrim Fathers first tried to flee England in 1607 and Boston Guildhall, a medieval building, is where they were once imprisoned. Maud Foster Windmill built in 1819 and still grinding flour, is also well worth a visit.







There's more than enough to make Lincoln an awesome day out.

Two Norman gems, the Castle and Cathedral, dominate the skyline for miles. Don't miss the new-look Lincoln Castle with imposing Victorian Prison, a new underground vault for the Magna Carta and stunning Wall Walk.

Standing across a medieval cobbled square, Lincoln Cathedral is a feast for the eyes and the senses. Even better, a joint Castle and Cathedral ticket offers entry to both – plus free return visit.



Wander the narrow streets, lined with boutique shops and cafes and visit award-winning museums. Hop aboard the Tour Lincoln double decker bus and take in all the city's main attractions.

Year-round events make it a destination for any season, with Lincoln Christmas Market, always the first weekend in December. an unmissable seasonal treat.



### **STAMFORD**

Think Cotswolds, but with fewer crowds! Discover 'hidden' England in this beautiful Georgian stone town, with more than 600 listed buildings.

This mellow limestone market town, on Lincolnshire's southern border, is a delight to explore, with some great independent and antiques shops too. Nestling on the edge of Stamford in acres of parkland, much of it landscaped by Capability Brown, is Burghley, England's greatest Elizabethan house.

### **CAISTOR**

An attractive mix of fine Georgian and Victorian buildings, a traditional market and a history dating back to before the Romans...welcome to the north Lincolnshire market town of Caistor.

Tucked away on the edge of the Wolds, Caistor – with markets every Wednesday and Sunday – boasts listed buildings and also over 160 significant archaeological finds. Recently awarded 'Walkers are Welcome' status, the long-distance Viking Way runs through the town.

There is a lot of fun to be had on a trip to Skegness, Mablethorpe & Sutton on Sea but safety is always an important issue to us. Here are a few tips to make sure you and your family stay safe on the beach this summer.

- · Always follow the advice from the lifequards.
- · Look out for information, warning signs and flags.
- · Swim where there is a lifeguard on duty, between the Red and Yellow flags.
- · Do not enter the water when the RED Flag is flying this denotes danger!
- Inflatables are fun but can be dangerous as you can easily be blown out to sea. The best advice is simple 'Don't use them on the sea'.
- · Swim with a friend never swim on your own.
- Don't eat or drink immediately before swimming as you may suffer cramps.
- · Don't consume alcohol before going into the sea.
- Be safe in the sun too much exposure to the sun's rays can be harmful. Always wear sun cream, at least SPF15 or above - even if it is cloudy.
- · If you see someone in difficulty, dial 999 and ask for the Coastguard.



- Wipes are **not** flushable, even if the label says they are. They may flush down your toilet bowl, but they don't break up in the pipe. They combine with other waste such as fat and cooking oil, sanitary pads and cotton buds, to cause blockages.
